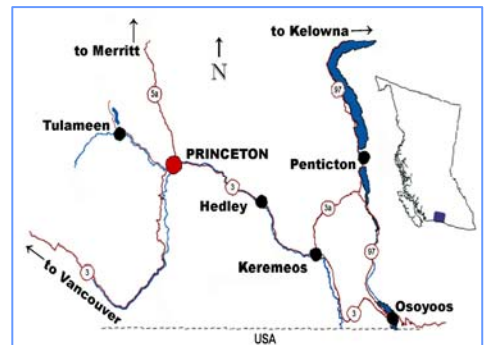
So Away ... So Near ...

Located in the heart of the Similkameen Valley at the foothills of the Cascade Mountains, Princeton is only hours from the urban centres of British Columbia ... yet it seems another world. The pace is leisurely. The air is clean. The landscape, lakes, and rivers beckon one to take pleasure in the outdoors. Nature remains unchanged here. Nearly every type of outdoor recreation can be enjoyed - hiking, camping, fishing, x-country skiing, mountain biking, photography, ...

Princeton receives only 356 mm (14 in) of precipitation annually. Daily maximum temperatures average -6°C in January and 26°C in July with little to no wind. Princeton enjoys 2,100 hours of bright sunshine per year, 280 in the winter months between November and February.

The community has one primary, one elementary, and one secondary school where children learn in a safe, friendly, respectful environment.

Princeton is the service centre for the Upper Similkameen Valley with a variety of stores, restaurants and services. Recreation amenities (that nature doesn't offer) include a skating arena with hockey leagues for all ages, a curling rink, baseball fields, outdoor swimming pool, tennis courts, skateboard park, and a playground with a small water park. Play the Princeton Golf Club's fun and challenging 18 hole course amid the towering Ponderosa pine trees or join the very active Naturalist Club and explore nature at its finest.
